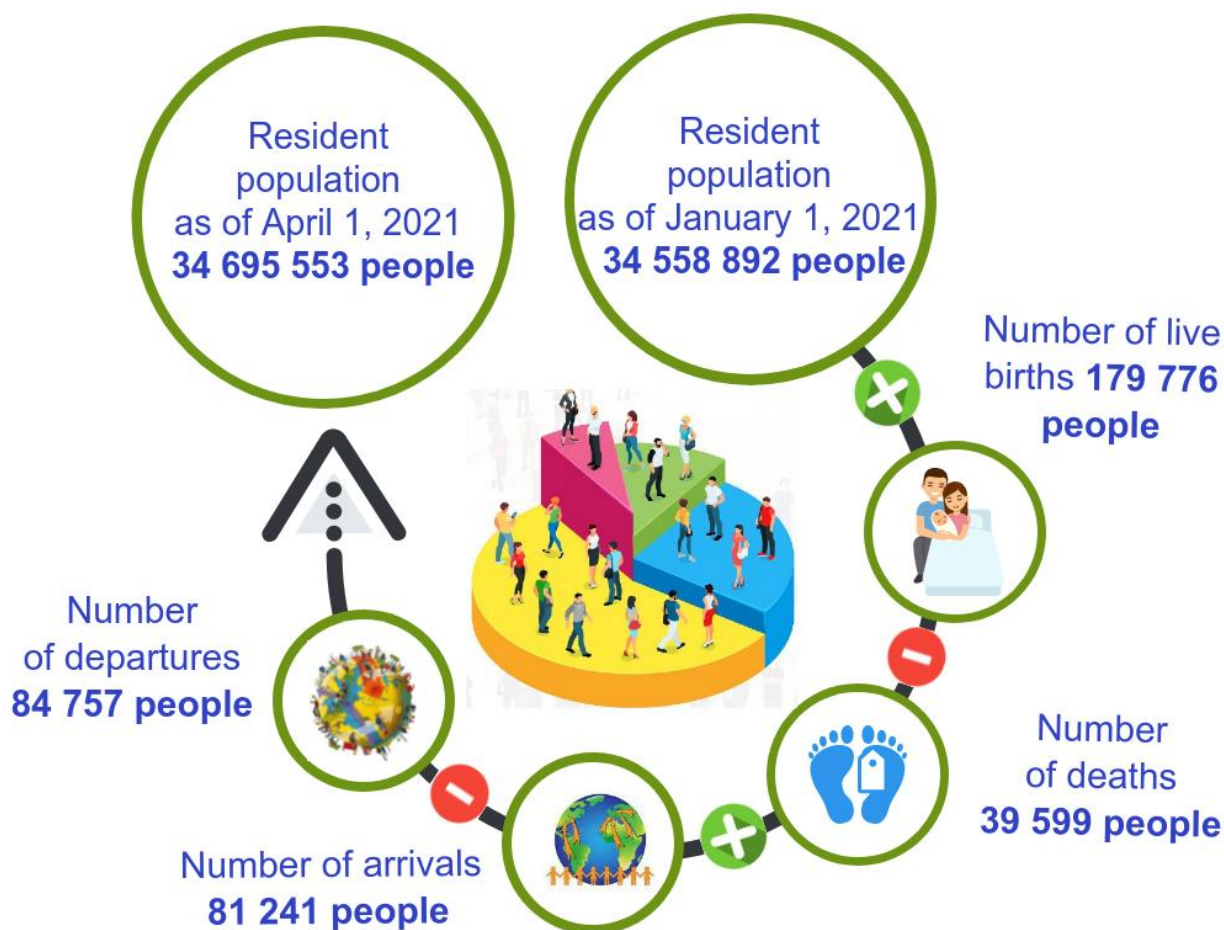

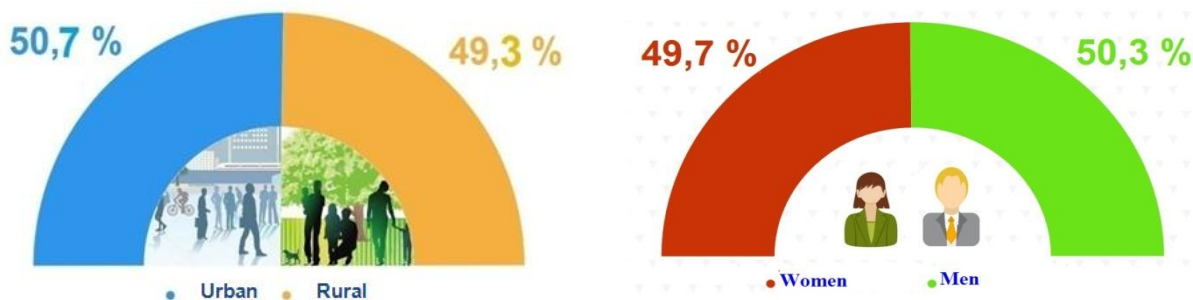
**The resident population** of the Republic of Uzbekistan as of April 1, 2021 amounted to **34 695,6** thousand people and, since the beginning of this year, has increased by **136,7** thousand people, or by **0,4%**. In particular, the urban population reached **17 581,6** thousand people (**50,7%** of the total population), rural – **17 114,0** thousand people (**49,3%**).



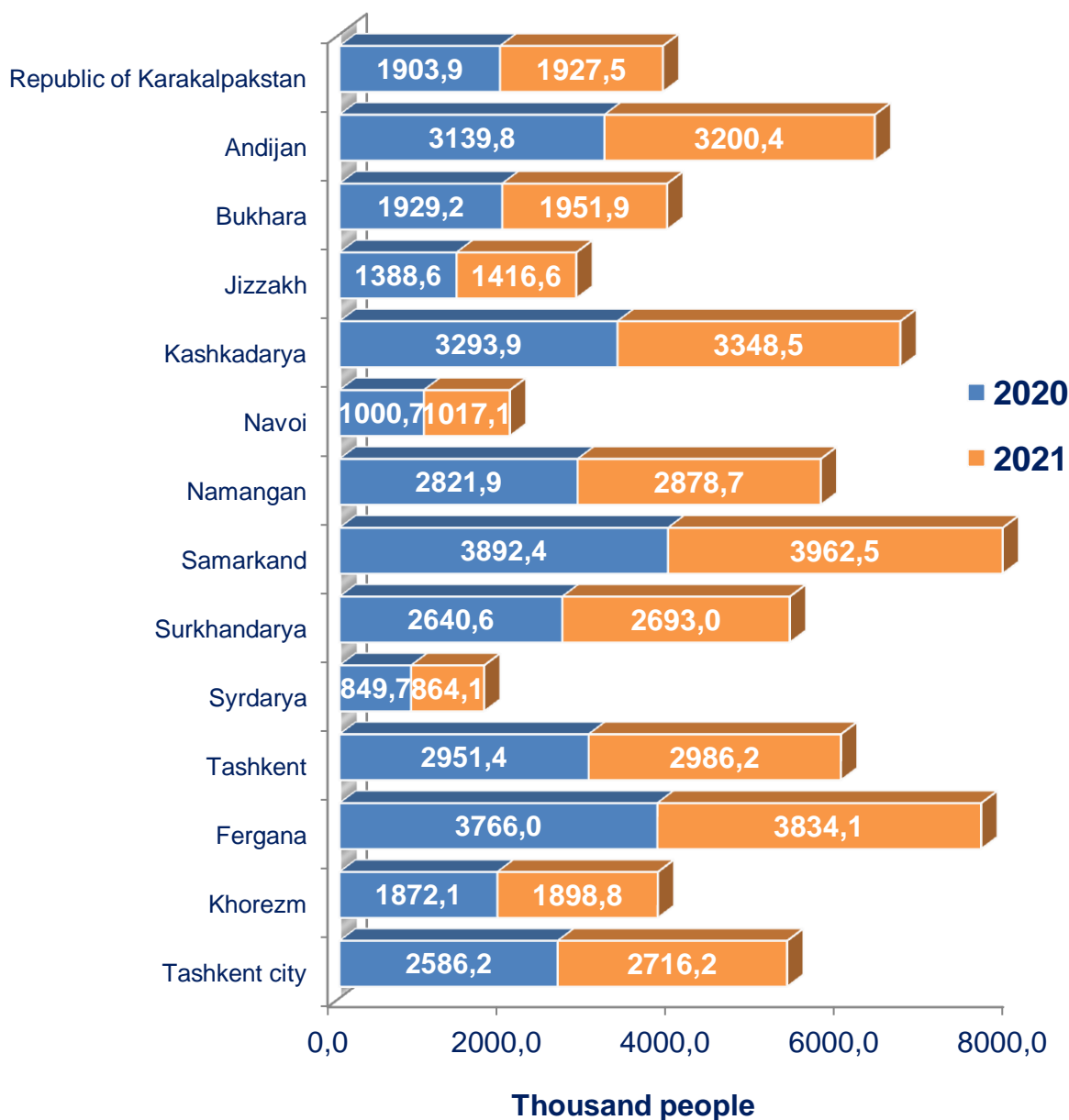
The resident population is calculated by adding the number of births and immigrants to the population at the beginning of the reporting year and subtracting the number of deaths and displacements.

(as of April 1, 2021)

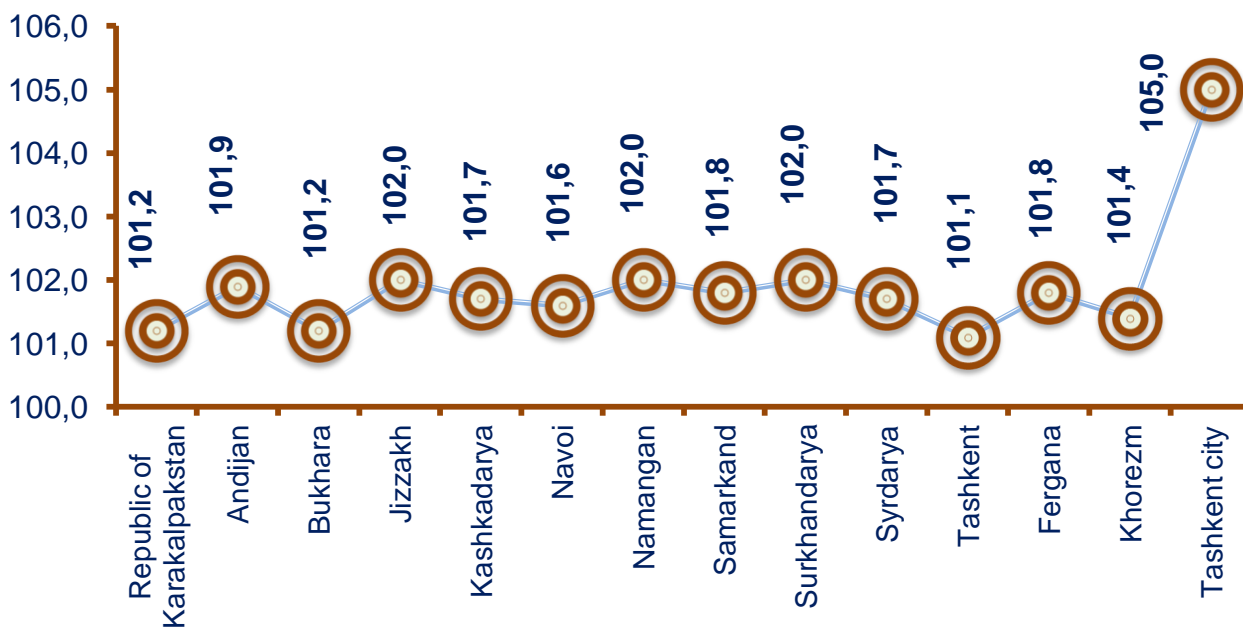


**Resident population by region**





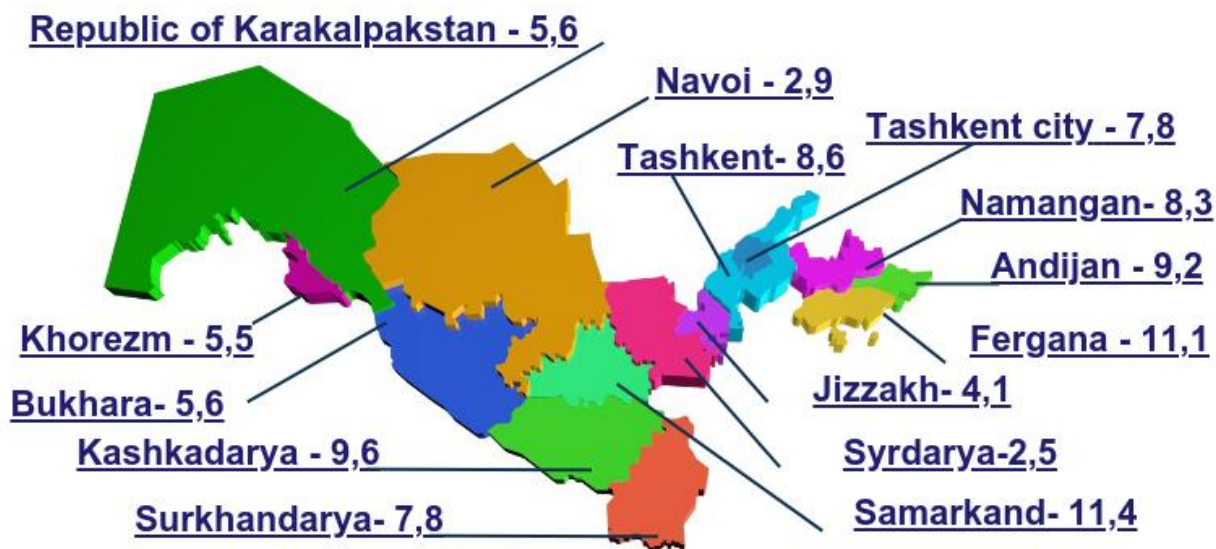
**Resident population growth rate**

The analysis showed that in the context of regions, as of April 1, 2021, the largest share in the total population of the republic is observed in Samarkand - 11,4%, Fergana - 11,1%, Kashkadarya - 9,6% and Andijan - 9,2% regions.



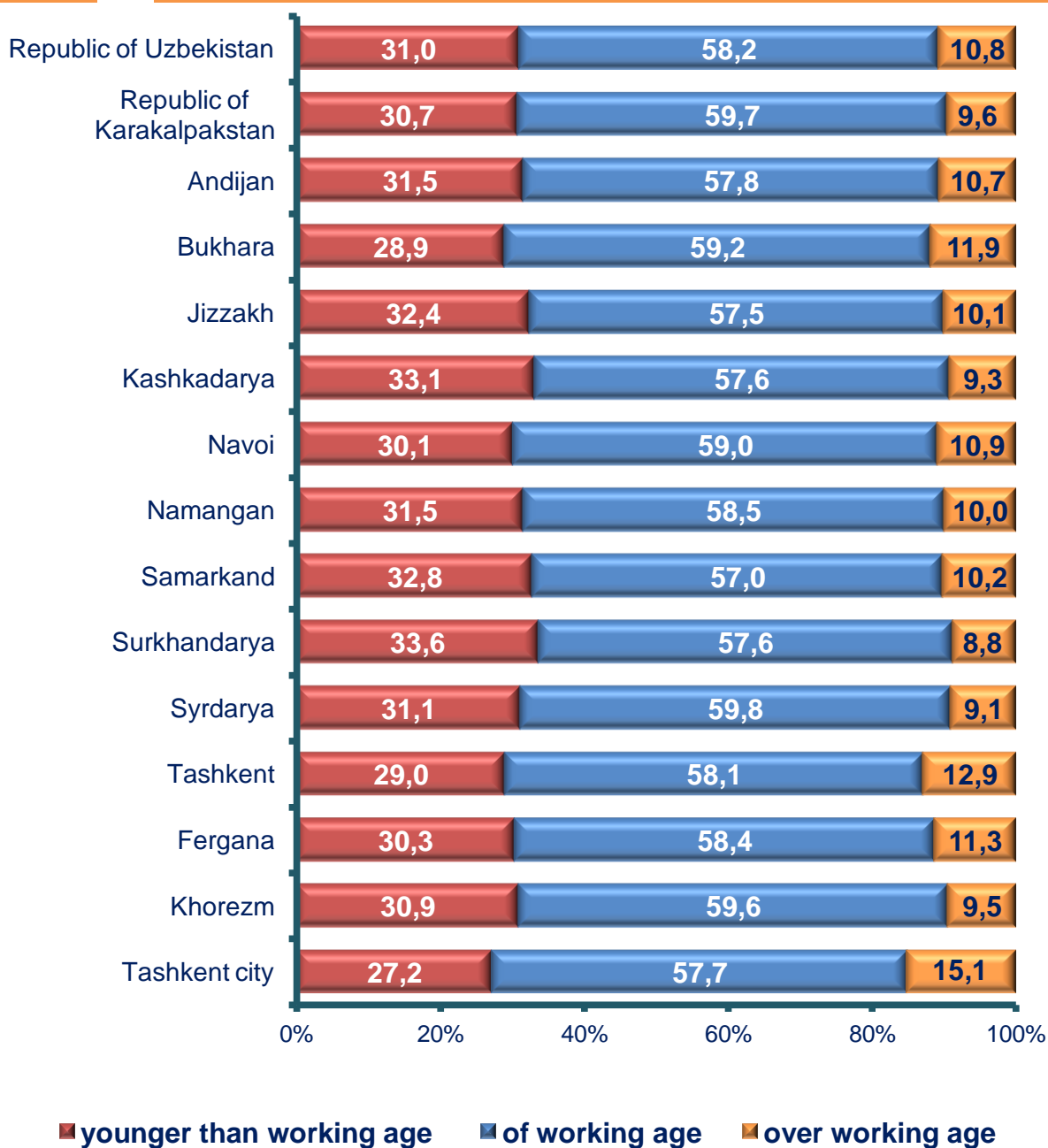
**Distribution of resident population by region**

According to preliminary data, as of April 1, 2021, **31,0%** of the total resident population in the republic are under working age, **58,2%** are of working age and **10,8%** are older than working age.

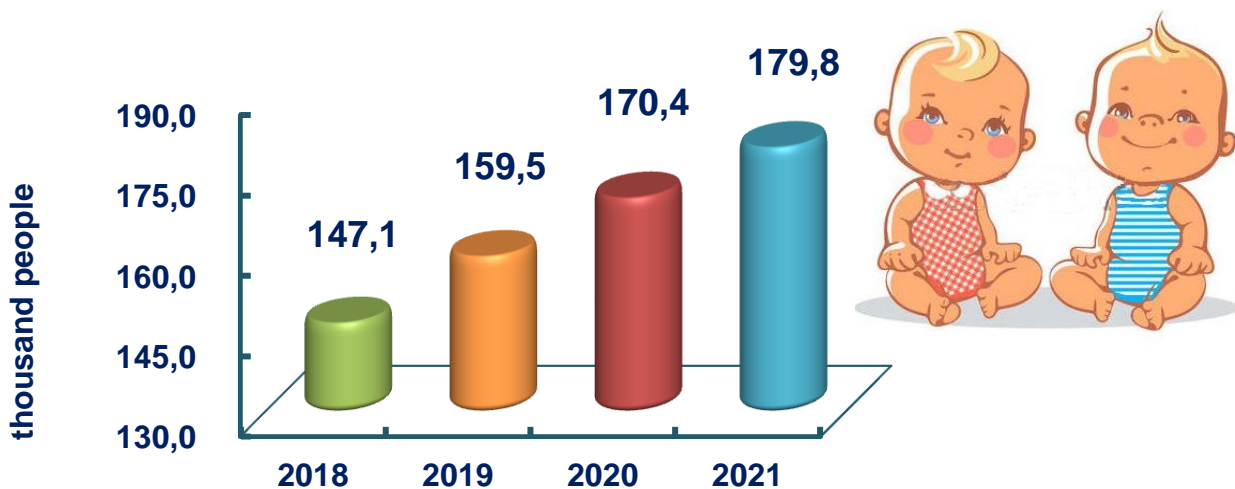


**Distribution of the resident population

(as of April 1, 2021, %)**

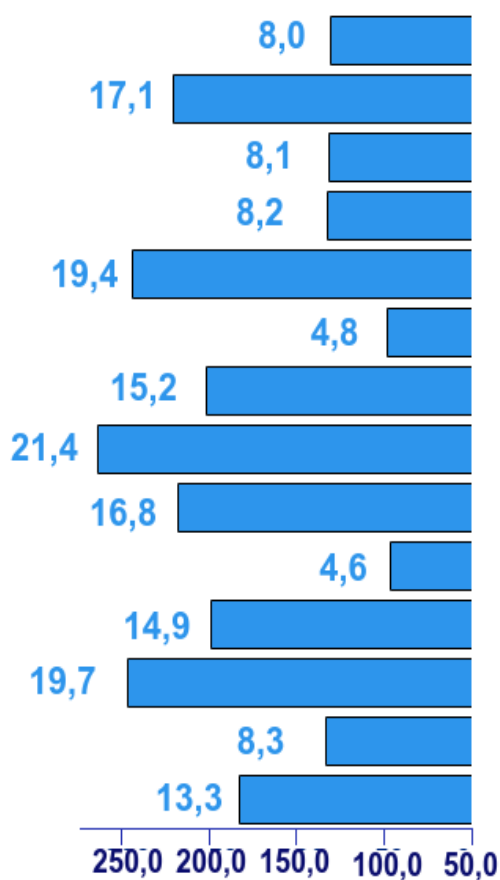




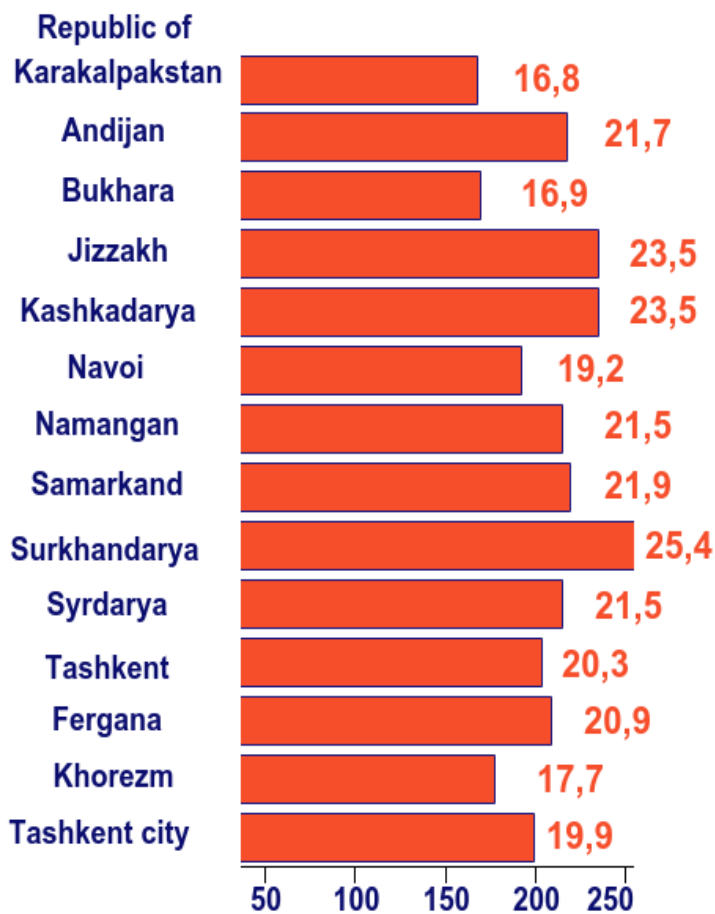
Number of live births



Number of births, thousand people



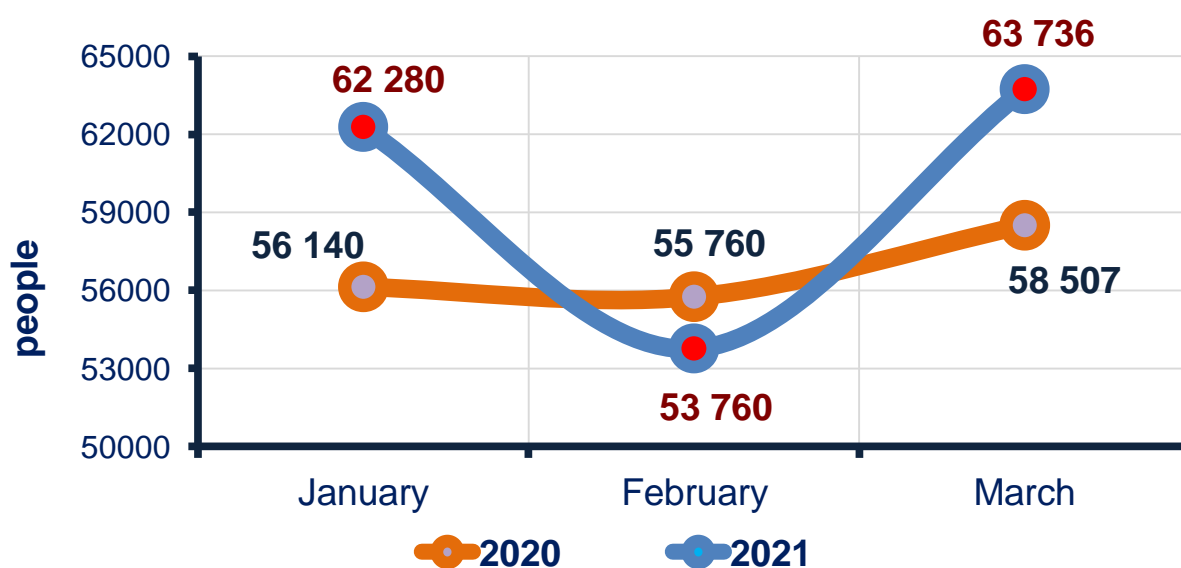
Fertility rate per 1000 population, *promille*



In January-March 2021, **179,8** thousand children were born, respectively, the birth rate per 1000 population was **21,1** promille and, compared to the same period in 2020, increased by **0,9** promille (in 2020 – **20,2** promille).



### Number of deaths by month



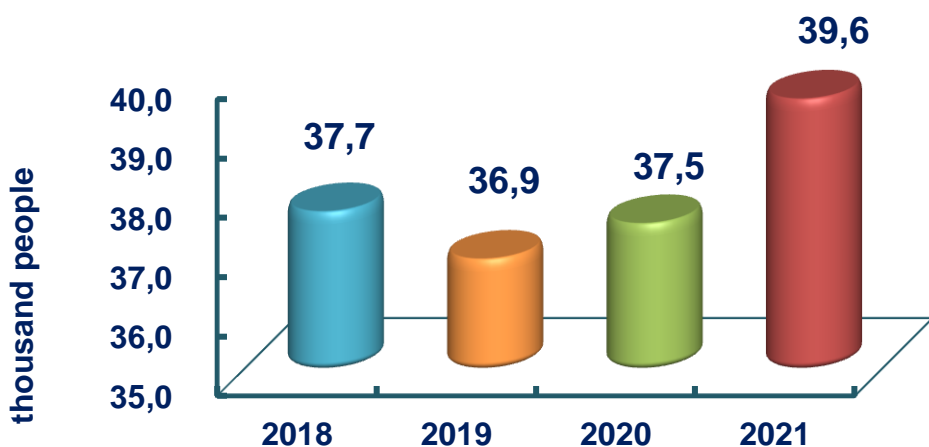
When analyzing the number of births by month, the largest number was observed in March 2021 (**63 736** people) and March 2020 (**58 507** people).

In contrast, the lowest number of births was recorded in February 2021 (**53 760** people) and February 2020 (**55 760** people).

Please note: a child is considered to be born alive if one of the criteria for live birth is present (breathing, heartbeat, pulsation of the navel, involuntary muscle contraction). In this case, the mother's pregnancy should be from 22 weeks or more, the child's height should be from 25 cm or more, the weight should be from 500 grams or more.



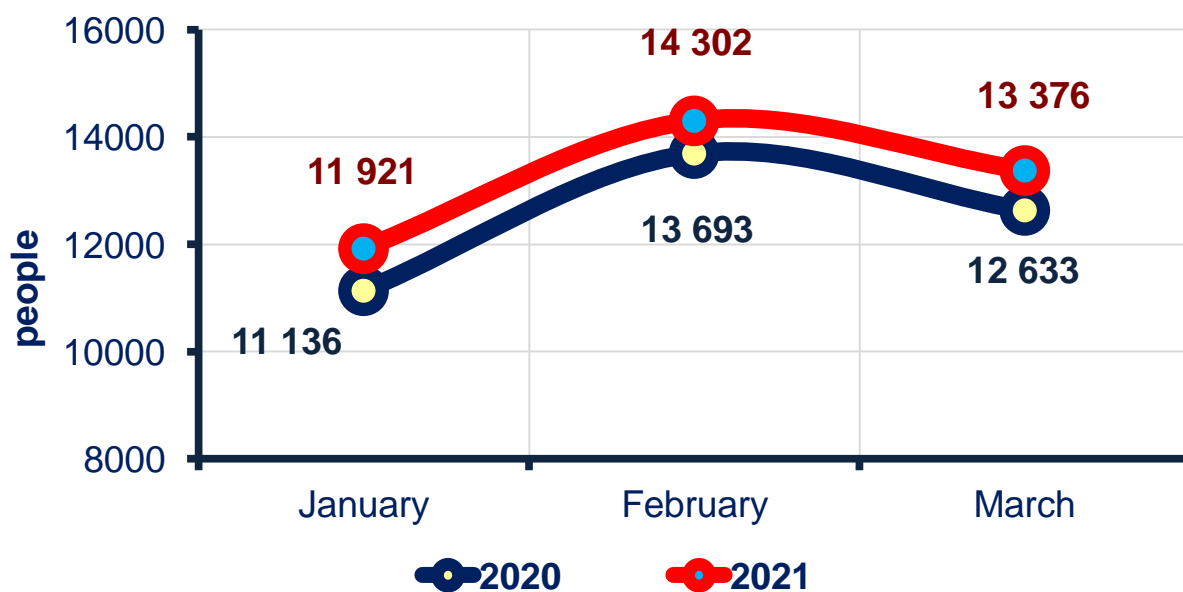
Number of death



**Mortality.** Over the past period of 2021, **39,6** thousand deaths were registered, respectively, the mortality rate was **4,6** promille and, compared to the same period in 2020, increased by **0,2** promille (in 2020 - by **4,4** promille).



Number of deaths by month

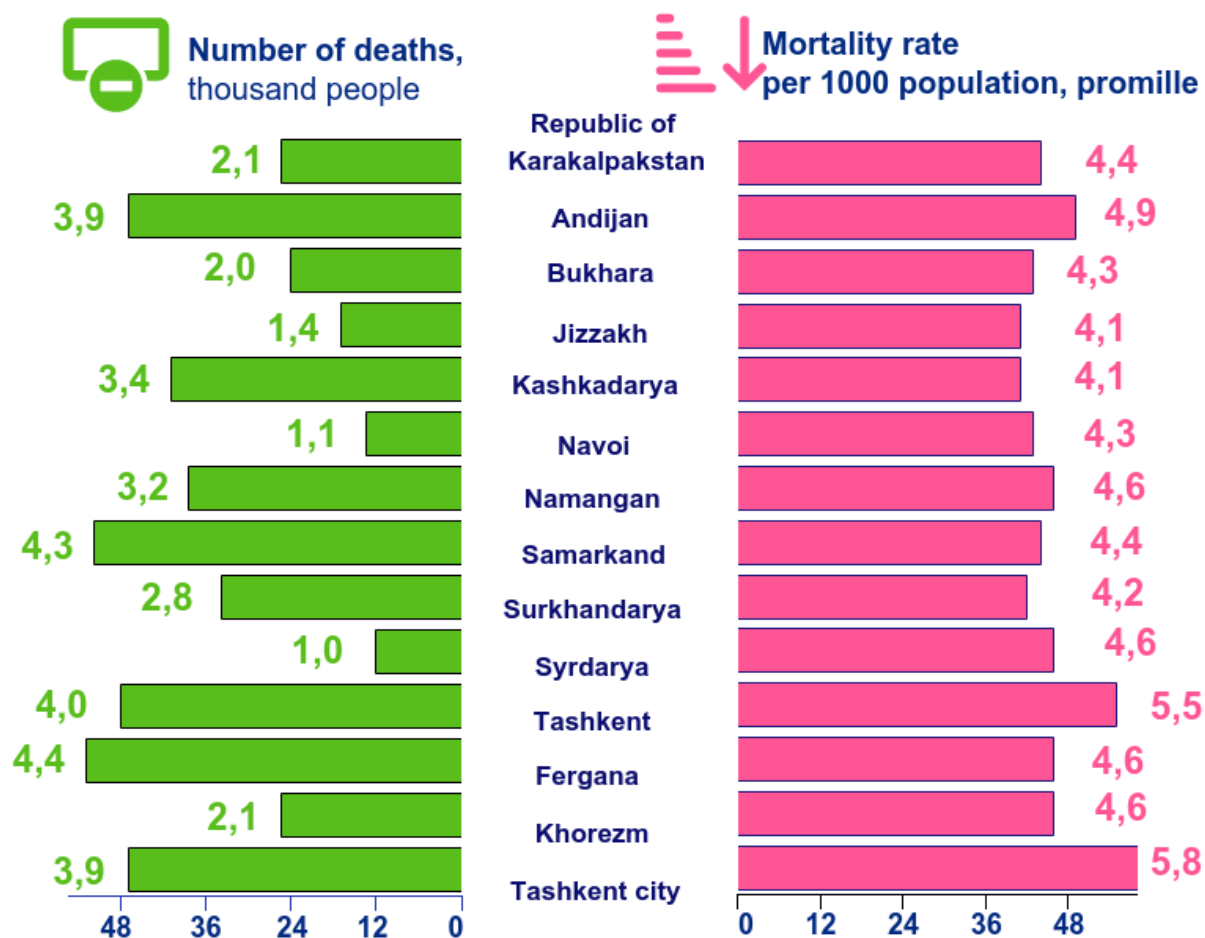


When analyzing mortality by region for the past period of 2021, the largest number of deaths per 1000 population was recorded in the city of Tashkent (5,8 promille),

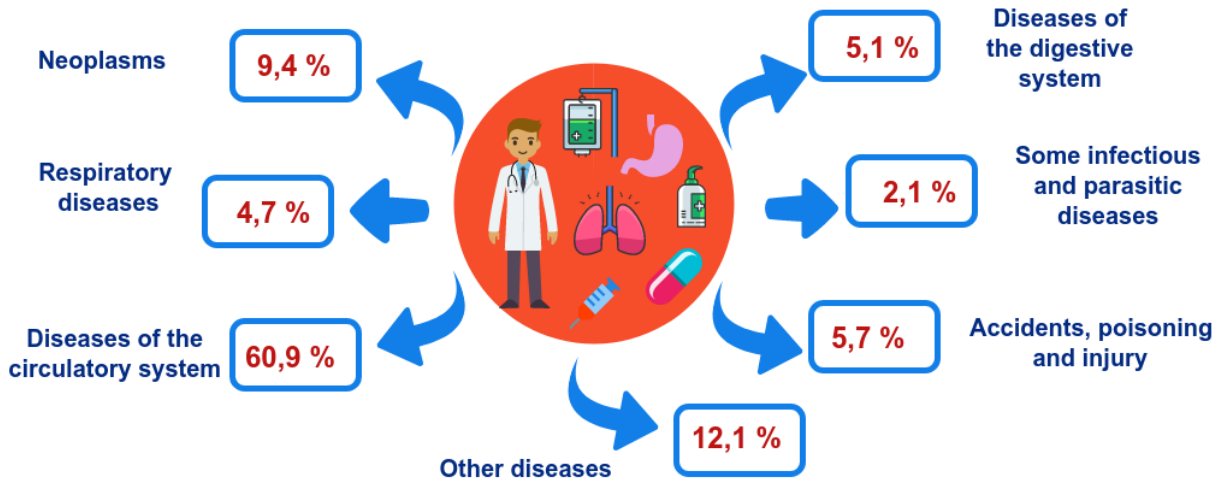
Conversely, the lowest mortality rate per 1000 inhabitants was noted in Jizzakh and Kashkadarya regions (4,1 promille).



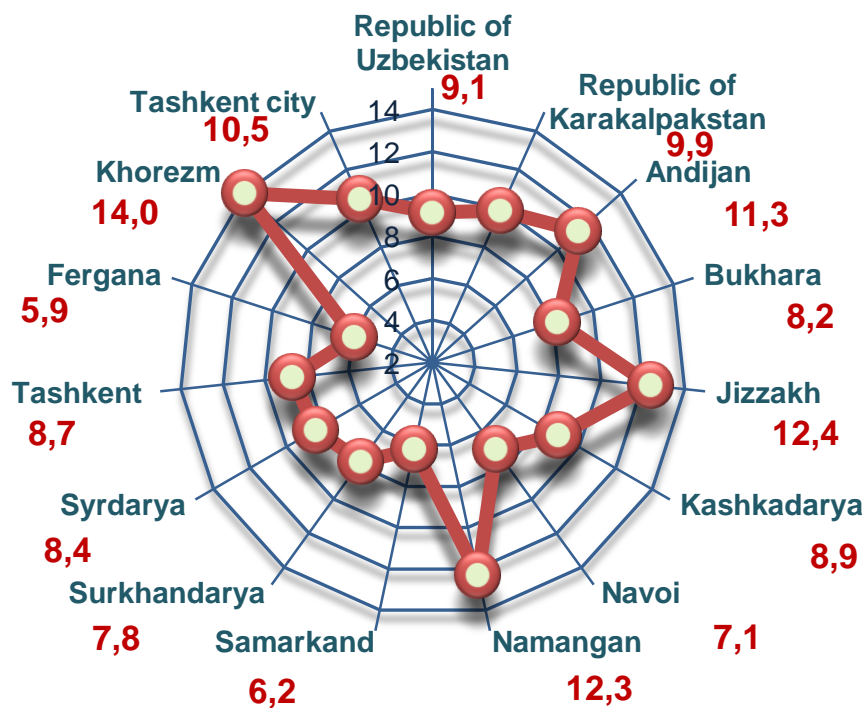
### The number and rate of deaths by region



Of the total number of registered deaths in January-March 2021, **60,9%** accounted for diseases of the circulatory system, **9,4%** - neoplasms, **5,7%** - accidents, poisoning and injuries, **5,1%** - diseases of the digestive system, **4,7%** - respiratory diseases, **2,1%** - infectious and parasitic diseases and **12,1%** - other diseases.



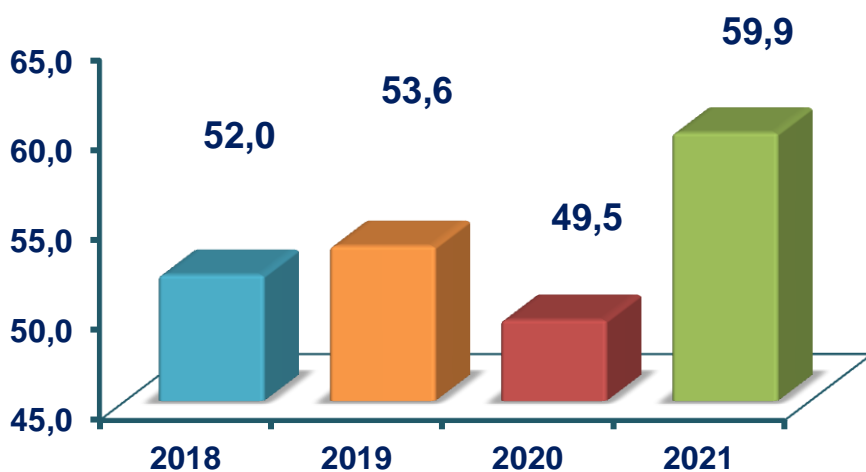
Infant mortality rate by region  
(per 1000 live births)



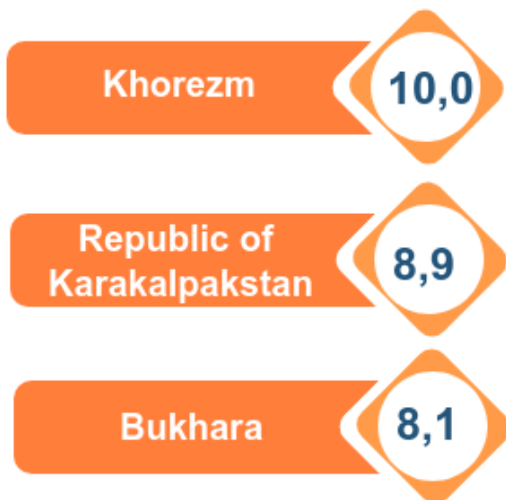
Over the past period, the number of registered deaths of children under the age of 1 year amounted to **1,8** thousand, of which **56,4%** died from conditions arising in the perinatal period, **18,3%** - from respiratory diseases, **13,1%** - from congenital anomalies, **3,6%** - from infectious and parasitic diseases, **2,1%** - from accidents, poisoning and injuries, **0,9%** - from diseases of the digestive system, **5,6%** - from other diseases.

(thousand units)

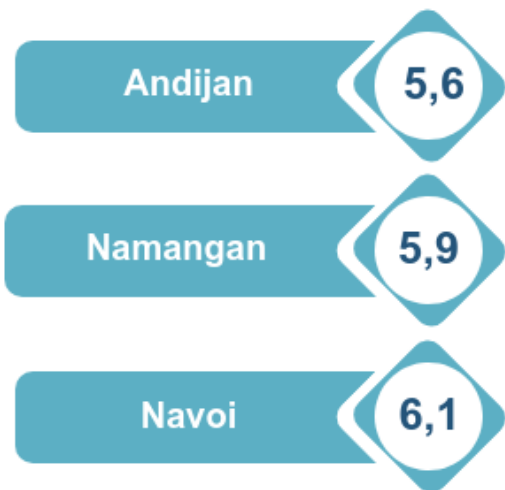


**Marriage rate by region**  
(per 1000 population)



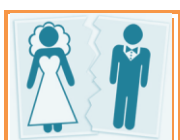
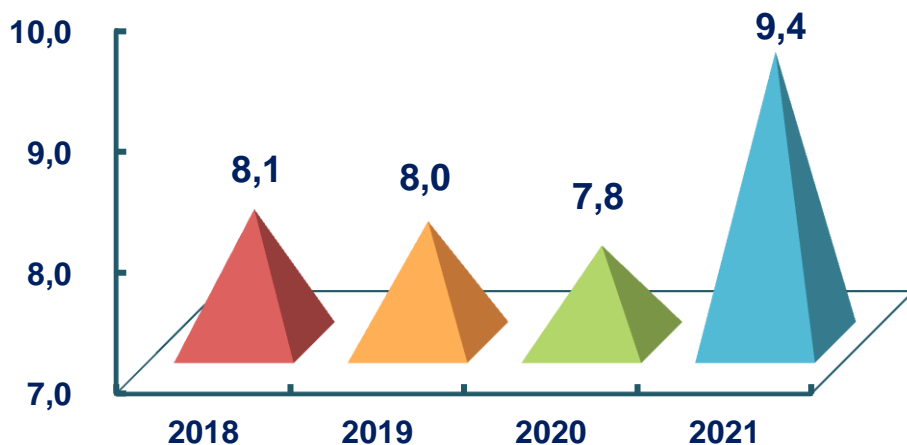
A high marriage rate (in promille) in the regions of the republic was noted in the Khorezm region (10,0), the Republic of Karakalpakstan (8,9), as well as in the Bukhara (8,1) region.

A low marriage rate (in promille) has developed in certain regions, for example, in such regions as Andijan (5,6), Namangan (5,9) and Navoi (6,1) regions.

The highest divorce rate (in promille) was observed in the city of Tashkent (2,0), Syrdarya (1,4), Andijan and Tashkent (1,3) regions.

Along with this, a low level of divorces (in promille) was recorded in the Republic of Karakalpakstan (0,7), Khorezm (0,8), Kashkadarya, Samarkand and Surkhandarya (0,9) regions.

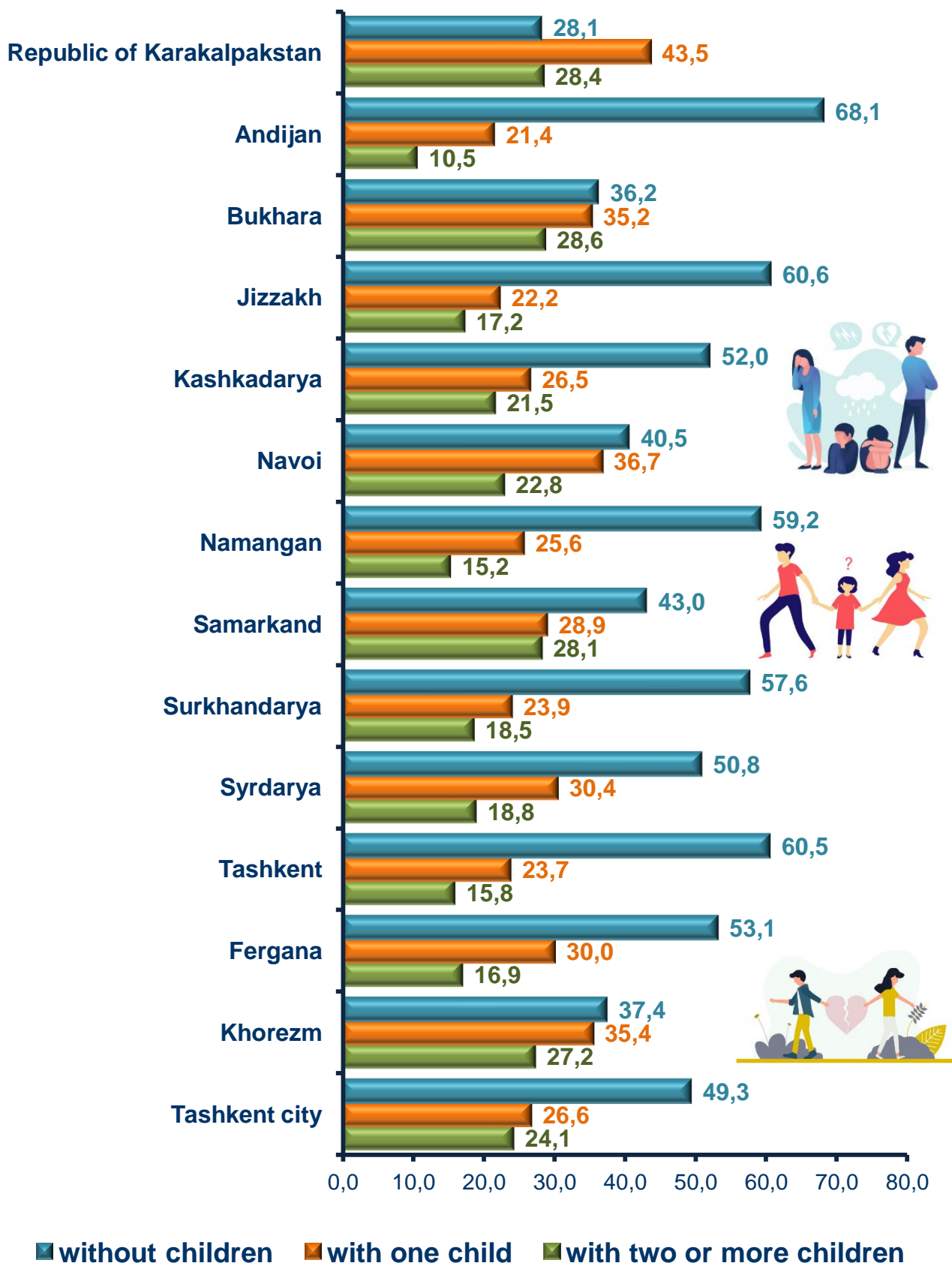

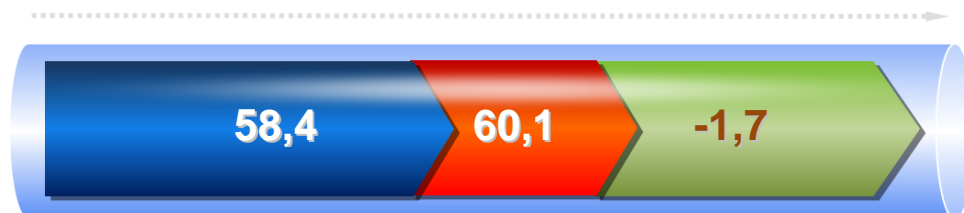
Distribution of divorces in regions by the total number of children,%

The migration balance in Kashkadarya region amounted to minus **2,9** thousand people, Samarkand - minus **2,3**, Surkhandarya - minus **1,8**, Bukhara - minus **1,3** thousand people, which indicates a significant excess of the outflow of the population over the arrival.

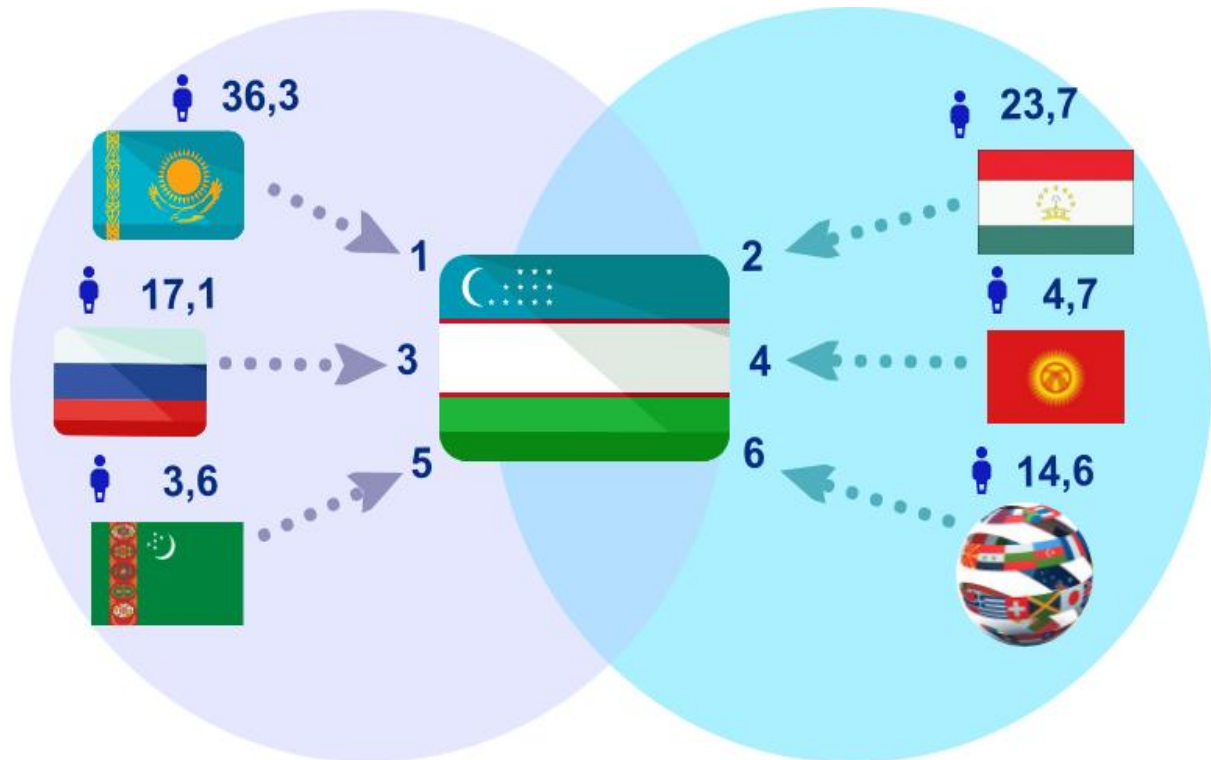
A positive balance of migration was noted in the city of Tashkent (plus **12,4** thousand people).

The number of arrivals from foreign countries, *in%*

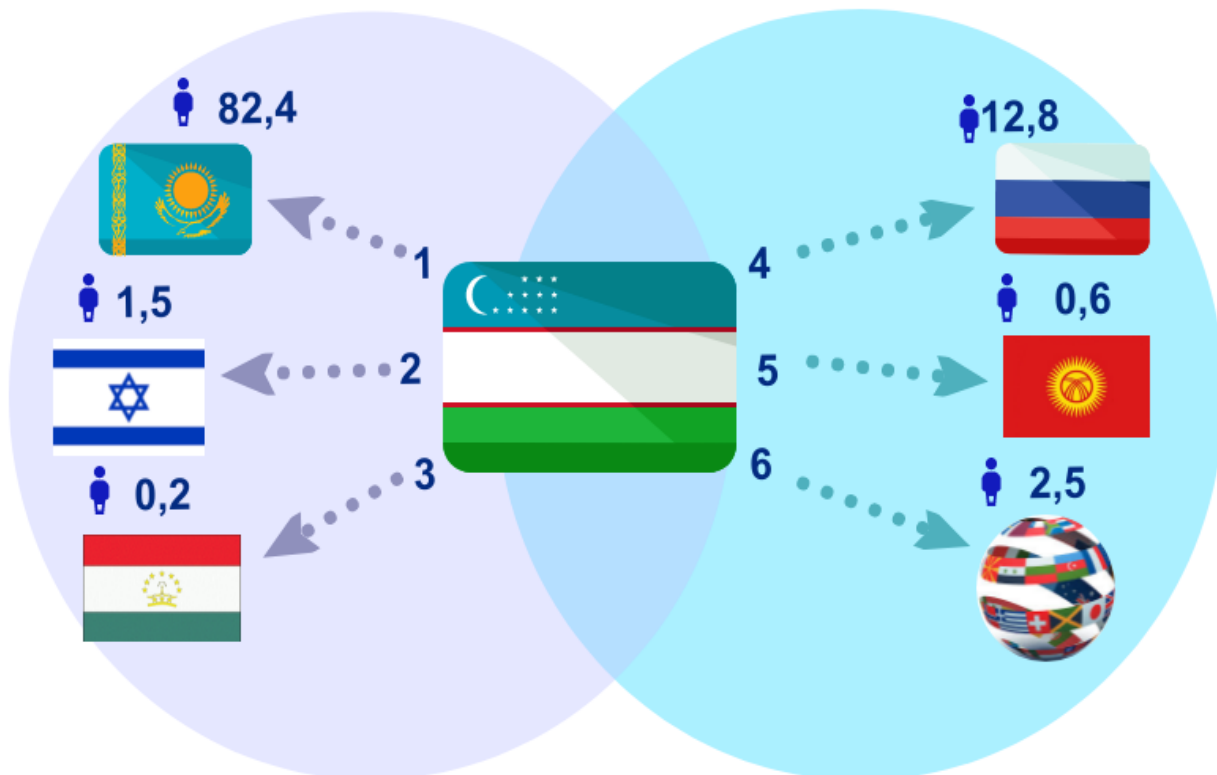


The largest share of arrivals from abroad to the Republic of Uzbekistan (in % of their total number) is accounted for by arrivals from Kazakhstan (**36,3%**), Tajikistan (**23,7%**), the Russian Federation (**17,1%**) and Kyrgyzstan (**4,7%**), the smallest - from Turkmenistan (**3,6%**) and other countries (**14,6%**).

The largest share of those who left the Republic of Uzbekistan (in % of their total number) is in Kazakhstan (**82,4%**), the Russian Federation (**12,8%**) and Israel (**1,5%**), the smallest - in Kyrgyzstan (**0,6%**), Tajikistan (**0,2%**) and other countries (**2,5%**).
