0. Prerequisites

0.1 Legal environment

0.1.1 Responsibility for collecting, processing, and disseminating statistics

The National Statistics Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan

On August 11, 2021, the Law of the Republic of Uzbekistan “On Official Statistics” was adopted, which was developed on the basis of the Generic Law on Official Statistics for Eastern Europe, Caucasus and Central Asia.

The purpose of the Law is to regulate relations in the field of official statistics. This Law applies to producers and users of official statistics, respondents and suppliers of administrative data, as well as relations arising between them related to the production, dissemination and coordination of official statistics.

Also, in accordance with the Regulations on the National Statistics Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan, approved by the Resolution of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan dated February 24, 2025 No. RP-75 “On measures to organize the activities of the National Statistics Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan”, the National Statistics Committee is responsible for compliance with the basic principles of official statistics and identity of statistical methodology consistent with international recommendations; organizing the collection of statistical data, statistical observations of households, conducting censuses, one-time counts, sample surveys and other statistical observations; providing users of all levels with official statistical data in the prescribed manner; maintaining statistical registers and classification systems for their use for statistical purposes.

At the same time, in accordance with Article 14 of the Law “On Official Statistics”, statistical authorities have the right:

- receive from state and economic management bodies, citizens' self-government bodies, banks and other organizations forms of statistical observation and use statistical observation data for statistical purposes;
- to carry out statistical observations of the activities of statistical units and use the obtained primary data for statistical purposes;
- to reward respondents - individuals for participating in statistical observations;
- to request and receive from state and economic management bodies, as well as from other organizations, information necessary for the implementation of statistical programs;

- involve on a contractual basis individuals and legal entities to collect statistical data necessary for the production of official statistics, in accordance with the law;
- use and introduce into the national statistical system modern methods and tools for collecting, processing, summarizing, analyzing, disseminating and storing statistical data;
- in case of revealing violations related to the presentation of statistical data, give instructions on their elimination and make appropriate corrections to the statistical data;
- within the limits of their powers, apply to officials who have violated the procedure for submitting statistical reports, measures of administrative penalties in accordance with the law.

According to Presidential Order №O-5054 dated September 12, 2017, economic and financial data in the country must comply with the requirements of the Enhanced General Data Dissemination System (e-GDDS) of the International Monetary Fund and be coordinated within the framework of this system.

Management of statistical processes, including the preparation and dissemination of statistical data, is carried out in accordance with national procedures developed on the basis of international quality management models (GSIM, GSBPM, GAMS0).

0.1.2 Data sharing and coordination among data producing agencies

The National Statistics Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan

According to article 11 of the Law on Official Statistics, producers of official statistics are guided by internationally recommended definitions, classifications and methodology when producing statistics.

The authorized state body, within the framework of statistical programs, coordinates the activities of other producers of official statistics.

Producers of official statistics coordinate the methodology for producing statistics within their mandate.

If a discrepancy with international recommendations is revealed in the statistical methodologies of other producers of official statistics, the authorized state body, based on the results of the audit of statistical methodologies, has the right to make them mandatory submissions.

Other producers of official statistics that are part of the national statistical system create subdivisions responsible for generating statistical data and ensuring information exchange with the authorized state body.

Producers of official statistics and suppliers of administrative data submit to the authorized state body the statistical and (or) administrative data they have at their disposal free of charge in the manner and terms established by statistical programs.

According to Article 10 of the Law “On Official Statistics”, the Statistical Council is a collegial advisory body on the development, functioning and coordination of official statistics under the authorized state body.

The composition of the Statistical Council is formed from representatives of government bodies, research organizations, non-governmental non-profit organizations, as well as national experts in statistics.

0.1.3 Confidentiality of individual reporters' data

The National Statistics Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan

According to Article 27 of the Law “On Official Statistics”, individual data held by the producers of official statistics are used exclusively for statistical purposes to compile aggregate statistical data. Individual data cannot be used by state bodies, citizens' self-government bodies and other organizations, including international ones, for the purposes of investigation, control, litigation, administrative decisions or for other purposes concerning individuals and legal entities or households.

The National Statistics Committee's employees must comply with the code of ethics, including the principle of confidentiality, not disclose any information provided to them in the performance of their duties.

They are informed of the responsibilities at the time of appointment. Each employee of the National Statistics Committee is obliged to sign an agreement that obliges him not to disclose such data.

0.1.4 Provision of statistical reporting

The National Statistics Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan

According to Article 14 of the Law “On Official Statistics”, state statistics bodies have the right to receive forms of statistical observation from bodies of state and economic management, self-government bodies of citizens, banks and other organizations. In accordance with Article 215 of the Code of the Republic of Uzbekistan “On Administrative Liability”, violation by officials of the procedure for submitting statistical reports, expressed in failure to submit reports and other data necessary for conducting statistical observations, distortion of reporting data or violation of the deadlines for submitting reports entails the imposition of a fine from seven to ten basic calculated values.

According to Article 16 of the Law “On Official Statistics”, when conducting statistical observations in accordance with statistical programs, respondents are obliged to provide producers of official statistics with reliable and complete data free of charge in the manner and terms established by the producer of official statistics.

0.2 Resources

0.2.1 Staff, facilities, computing resources, and financing

There are 7 employees in the Social Statistics Department of the National Statistics Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan. The department consists of 3 divisions.

Training of personnel in tourism statistics is carried out on an ongoing basis. Specifically, department employees enhance their qualifications through training courses organized by the Institute for Professional Development and Statistical Research of the National Statistics Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan, as well as through other seminars held by international statistical organizations.

The department has a sufficient number of computers, with each employee provided an individual computer. All computers are connected to the local network and have internet access. Financial resources are provided within the framework of the statistical program and are sufficient to perform the statistical work stipulated by this program.

1.Integrity

1.1 Professionalism

1.1.1 Impartiality of statistics

The National Statistics Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan

According to Article 6 of the Law “On Official Statistics”, the main principles of official statistics are impartiality and objectivity.

According to Article 13 of the Law “On Official Statistics”, state bodies, other organizations and their officials are not entitled to interfere with the activities of state statistics bodies carried out in accordance with this Law.

Territorial departments of statistics, departments of statistics of districts (cities) are independent from local government bodies and are directly subordinate to the authorized government body.

When selecting the employees and appointing them to senior positions, their experience and professionalism in the field of statistics are taken into account. Improvement of the qualification of the department's employees is ensured through participation in training courses organized by the Institute for Professional Development and Statistical Research of the National Statistics Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan, as well as in training courses, training seminars organized by international organizations. Employees of the department give lectures at training courses organized by the Institute for Professional Development and Statistical Research. The placement of scientific articles of the department's employees in the mass media has been organized.

1.1.2 Selection of sources, methodology, and modes of dissemination

The National Statistics Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan

According to Article 33 of the Law “On Official Statistics”:

Producers of official statistics assess the quality of official statistics on an ongoing basis. To ensure quality assurance, official statistics are produced and disseminated on the basis of general principles and methods concerning coverage, definitions, statistical units and classifications of official statistics.

In order to improve the quality of official statistics, producers of official statistics have the right to analyze and edit data, combine data from various sources, link and compare data for statistical purposes, and use statistical methods to evaluate them.

Producers of Official Statistics document the sources and methods used in the production process as well as the resulting datasets. Users of official statistics are informed about the sources and methods of producing statistics and about the quality of official statistics through metadata.

1.1.3 Commenting on erroneous interpretation and misuse of statistics

The National Statistics Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan

The National Statistics Committee may comment on misinterpretation and misuse of statistical data.

1.2 Transparency

1.2.1 Disclosure of terms and conditions for statistical collection, processing, and dissemination

The National Statistics Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan

According to Article 6 of the Law “On Official Statistics”, the main principles of official statistics are clarity and transparency. The conditions for the collection, processing and dissemination of statistical data are included in the legislative acts of the Republic of Uzbekistan concerning statistics. These laws are posted on websites and are thus available to the public. The Law “On Official Statistics” and the statistical program, which clearly defines the terms for the development and dissemination of statistical data, are posted on the official website of the National Statistics Committee (<https://stat.uz>). The law is available in the bulletin of the Oliy Majlis, the database of regulatory legal acts (norm), as well as in the database of the Ministry of Justice located at www.lex.uz . Statistical reporting forms submitted by respondents to generate statistical data are published in advance for users on the National Statistics Committee's official website.

1.2.2 Internal governmental access to statistics prior to release

The National Statistics Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan

The government does not have access to the statistics produced by the National Statistics Committee prior to their publication. State statistical bodies are independent in the dissemination of statistical data. Interference by state bodies is not allowed (Article 13 of the Law “On Official Statistics”). Only the Chairman of the Committee, his deputies and responsible employees have access to statistical data prior to their publication.

1.2.3 Attribution of statistical products

The National Statistics Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan

The logo and footnotes clearly identify that the information published for the public in print statistical publications, information bulletins and in mass media is produced by the National Statistics Committee.

1.2.4 Advance notice of major changes in methodology, source data, and statistical techniques

The National Statistics Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan

The National Statistics Committee notifies the public in advance about the transition to a new methodology and significant changes in existing methods and approaches. The National Statistics Committee posts on its official website the relevant methodological guidelines explaining what changes users should expect. The expected changes are communicated to the public in articles, news and press conferences.

1.3. Ethical standards

1.3.1 Guideline for staff behavior

The National Statistics Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan

The Rules of Conduct for the National Statistics Committee's employees were approved. They are required to comply with a code of ethics, including the principle of confidentiality, and must not disclose any information provided to them in the performance of their assigned duties. They are informed of these obligations upon appointment. An employee of the National Statistics Committee is obliged to conclude an agreement containing an obligation not to disclose individual data.

2. Methodology

2.1 Concepts and definitions

2.1.1 Concepts and definitions

The methodological basis for accounting for indicators of "Activities of collective accommodation facilities" is the "Methodological provisions on tourism statistics."

Collective accommodation facilities refer to the total number of establishments providing temporary accommodation services for guests in a country (or region) during the reporting period. These facilities are designed to offer overnight stays, lodging, household services, and additional amenities to the population and visitors. They include various categories of hotels, motels, guest houses, dormitories, sanatoriums, rest homes, boarding houses, tourist camps, and other similar accommodation facilities.

2.2 Scope

2.2.1 Scope

2.2.1.1 Scope of the data

The geographical coverage of the data encompasses the Republic of Karakalpakstan, 12 regions, and the city of Tashkent.

To compile data on the activities of collective accommodation facilities, information from annual statistical reports submitted once a year by legal entities providing tourist and excursion services and accommodation services (collective accommodation facilities) is used. This includes Form 1-tourism "Report on accommodation and services for visitors" and Form 1-kb (tour) (appendix to Form 1-kb) "Report of a microfirm and small enterprise on accommodation and services for visitors."

2.2.1.2 Exceptions to coverage

There are no exceptions when calculating the performance indicators of collective accommodation facilities.

2.2.1.3 Unrecorded activity

There is no unrecorded activity.

Law of the Republic of Uzbekistan No. LRU-549 dated July 18, 2019 "On tourism."

2.4.3 Grossing/netting procedures

In the process of forming the gross indicator, all entities engaged in activities related to collective accommodation facilities are taken into account, regardless of their organizational and legal form.

3. Accuracy and reliability

3.1 Source data

3.1.1 Source data collection programs

Data on the performance indicators of collective accommodation facilities are collected by creating a catalog of enterprises with the codes of the National Classification on kinds of Economic Activities of the Republic of Uzbekistan (rev. 2) **55.10.0, 55.20.0, 86.10.0, 87.10.0** and **86.90.0**. The main source of information is the activity of collective accommodation facilities (hotels and similar establishments). These enterprises annually submit the following statistical reports: Form 1-turizm - "Report on accommodation and services for visitors," Form 1-kb (tur) (Appendix to Form 1 kb) - "Report of a microfirm and small enterprise on accommodation and services for visitors."

Reports are submitted through the e-Stat 4 electronic application. The submitted data are compiled and summarized by the National Statistics Committee in accordance with established procedures.

3.1.2 Source data definitions, scope, sectorization, classifications, valuation, and time of recording

Primary statistical data about the operations, available capacities, number of accommodated persons, and volume of services provided by hotels, motels, guest houses, sanatoriums, recreation areas, and other collective accommodation facilities in the region during the reporting period is used to compile indicators of their activities. These data are submitted by enterprises to the statistical bodies through the e-Stat 4 electronic application according to established procedures.

Coverage:

The geographic coverage of the data includes the Republic of Karakalpakstan, 12 regions, and the city of Tashkent. All collective accommodation facilities operating in the Republic of Karakalpakstan, regions, and the city of Tashkent with the codes of the National Classification on kinds of Economic Activities of the Republic of Uzbekistan (rev. 2) **55.10.0, 55.20.0, 86.10.0, 87.10.0** and **86.90.0** are subject to registration. Data from the Sanatorium Registry of the Tourism Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan is also utilized.

The indicator covers all types of collective accommodation facilities:

- Hotels and similar accommodation facilities;
- Specialized accommodation facilities;
- Individual accommodation facilities;
- Other accommodation facilities.

Exclusions from coverage:

Activities related to renting out apartments within the housing stock (short-term rental services in private houses or apartments intended for permanent residence, if they are not registered as a legal entity);

Dormitories established by enterprises for their employees;

Travel agencies and tour operators;

Temporary accommodation services provided on vehicles;

Subdivisions within rest homes or camps that are not registered as independent economic entities.

Classifications:

Source data are classified according to the following criteria:

a) by ownership form:

State and private organizations

b) by type of activity:

The indicator covers all types of collective accommodation facilities:

Hotels and similar accommodation facilities;

Specialized accommodation facilities;

Individual accommodation facilities;

Other accommodation facilities.

By activity status:

Active

Temporarily inactive

Closed (excluded only in its pure form)

Assessment of source data:

The provided information is evaluated and verified through:

Comparison with the Tourism Committee registers;

Identification of changes in organizational and legal status;

Elimination of duplicate records;

Clarification of address, name, and type of activity;

For discrepancies identified during the assessment, additional information may be requested or a resubmission of information may be required.

Accounting period

The accounting period is typically 1 year, and the indicators are compiled as of the end of the reporting year (December 31).

Changes in organizations established, reorganized, or liquidated during the year are recorded at the end of the period.

Final clarification is carried out based on updating the departmental register, submission of statistical reports, and inspections by territorial bodies.

3.1.3 Source data timeliness

Timely preparation of initial data on indicators of collective accommodation facilities' activities involves informing respondents about the timely submission of annual statistical reports in the prescribed manner according to the forms 1 turizm "Report on accommodation and visitor services," 1 kb (tur) (Appendix to the 1 kb form) "Report of a microfirm and small enterprise on accommodation and visitor services." This reporting is fully collected within the established timeframe. The National Statistics Committee prepares data in the form of bulletins and tables once a year in accordance with the annual statistical program.

3.2 Assessment of source data

3.2.1 Source data assessment

Data on "The Activities of Collective Accommodation Facilities" are assessed, and if discrepancies exist between them, the reasons are identified. To prevent such cases in the future, explanatory work is organized with respondents.

3.3 Statistical techniques

3.3.1 Source data statistical techniques

Statistical processing of source data when forming indicators of collective accommodation facilities' activities aims to ensure accuracy, consistency, elimination of data duplication, and reliability of final indicators. This process is carried out based on the following statistical methods:

1. Logical control

The correspondence between the name, address, type, and status of the organization's activities is verified.

If discrepancies are found in the submitted information, a follow-up request for clarification is immediately sent to enterprises and organizations.

2. Structural analysis

The structure of organizations is analyzed by legal form, type, and areas of activity.

Changes in the structure of organizations are compared structurally.

3. Deduplication (elimination of duplicate data)

Cases are identified where the same organization has been entered twice or more under different names or addresses.

Duplicate entries are eliminated by cross-checking with departmental registers.

4. Time-series comparison

Current year indicators are compared with data from previous years.

If cases of sharp increase or decrease are identified, the reasons (establishment, liquidation, merger, reorganization) are clarified.

5. Cross-checking

The compatibility of the organization registry is verified against multiple sources.

6. Coverage checks

The list of organizations that submitted reports is compared with those that did not.

Organizations that should have been covered but did not report are identified, and additional verification is conducted.

7. Comparative analysis

The ratios of the number of collective accommodation facilities across districts, cities, and regions are analyzed.

In case of logical inconsistencies between regions, they are clarified through territorial bodies.

8. Data cleaning

Technical errors, gaps, incorrect codes, and incorrectly classified organizations are identified.

Corrections are made for each error.

9. Final validation

After all stages of verification are completed, the final list is compiled.

3.3.2 Other statistical procedures

3.4.1 Validation of intermediate results

4.1 Periodicity and timeliness

4.1.1 Periodicity

Periodicity and timeliness comply with generally accepted data dissemination standards. Statistical data on the "Activities of collective accommodation facilities" are published annually.

The production of statistical data for this indicator and the dissemination of annual data are carried out in accordance with the data publication calendar based on the statistical program.

4.2.1 Internal consistency

Current year indicators are compared with data from previous years.

If cases of sharp growth or decline are identified, the reasons (creation of a new entity, liquidation, merger, reorganization) are clarified.

Comparability between sectors and areas is not applicable to this indicator.

4.3 Revision

4.3.1 Revision and/or update schedule

The deadlines for the formation of preliminary data and the finalization of data based on their revision are determined in advance in the Statistical Program. The Statistical Program is posted on the official website of the National Statistics Committee (<https://stat.uz>) and is also published on the official website of the Ministry of Justice www.lex.uz.

4.3.2 Identification of preliminary and/or revised/updated data

Final data are disseminated.

4.3.3 Dissemination of revision studies and analyses

Statistical compilations indicate the revision of some indicators for the previous year. Revised (final) data are disseminated through publications of the National Statistics Committee. Users are informed of the results of the analysis of identified differences through comments in publications.

5. Accessibility

5.1 Data

5.1.1 Statistical presentation

The data are posted on the official website of the National Statistics Committee, presented in statistical compilations, and also provided upon request to legal entities and individuals.

5.1.2 Dissemination media and format

5.1.2.1 Hard copy - New release

Data are provided to users in printed form through publications of the National Statistics Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan: "Standard of Living" (once a year), "Uzbekistan in Figures" (once a year), "Women and Men" (once every two years). In addition, data is provided in the form of agreed tables to government bodies and other users upon their request.

5.1.2.2 Hard copy - Monthly bulletin

This information is provided to users annually through the statistical bulletin "Main Indicators of Tourism and Recreation Development in the Republic of Uzbekistan." In addition, it is provided in the form of agreed tables to government bodies and other users upon their request.

In the form of tables, according to user requests.

5.1.2.6 Electronic - On-line bulletin or data

The annual press release "Development of Tourism and Recreation in the Republic of Uzbekistan" is published on the website <https://stat.uz> and is updated annually.

5.1.3 Advance release calendar

This indicator is published on the official website of the National Statistics Committee (<https://stat.uz>, <https://siat.stat.uz>) in accordance with the calendar for the publication of official statistical data, which is made available to the public in advance, and within the timeframes established in the annual Statistical Program.

5.1.4 Simultaneous release

The indicator is published on the official website of the National Statistics Committee (<https://stat.uz>, <https://siat.stat.uz>) in accordance with the deadlines established in the publicly available calendar for the release of official statistical information and in the annual Statistical Program.

5.1.5 Dissemination on request

According to the relevant regulatory documents of the Republic of Uzbekistan, statistical data are provided to users upon their request in the prescribed manner. Dissemination of statistical information is carried out at the request of legal entities or individuals in the form of printed or electronic tables, statistical compilations, bulletins, express information, as well as in accordance with agreements between parties on information exchange.
