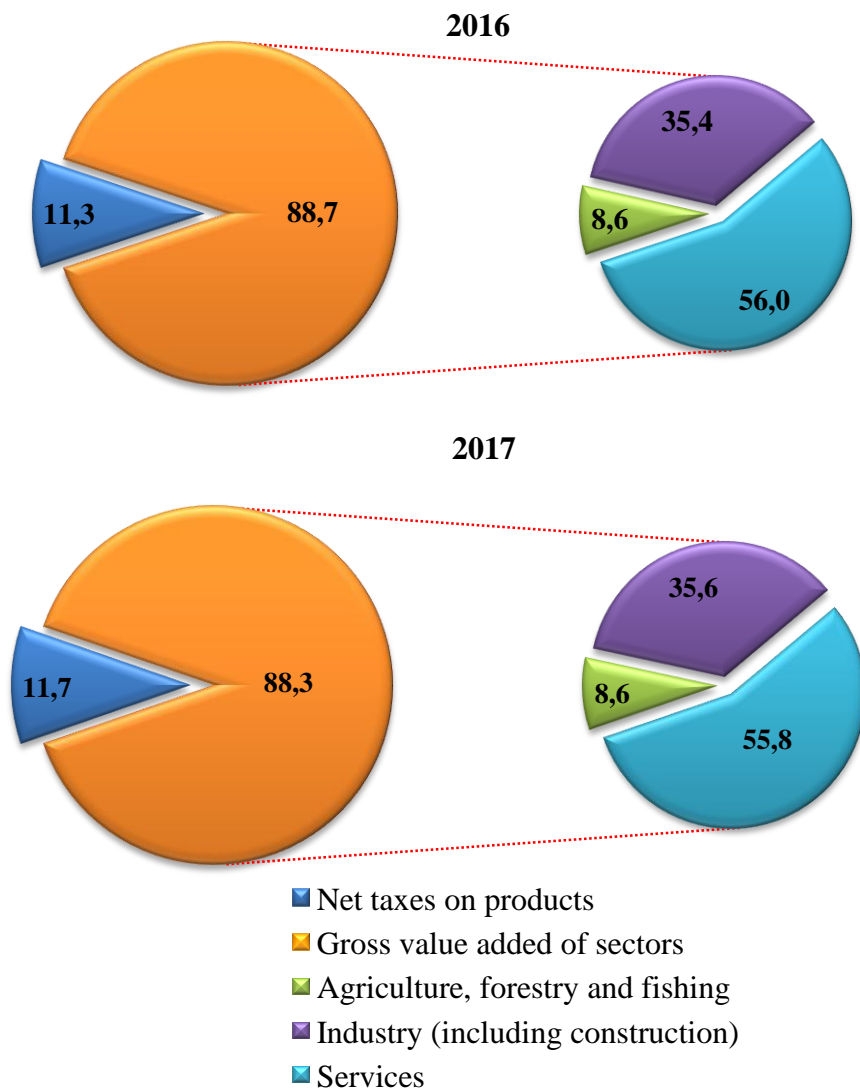


PRODUCTION OF GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT

In January-June 2017 according to the preliminary data the volume of gross domestic product (GDP) amounted to 102 702,1 billion soums at current prices, the increase – 7,0 percent in comparison with January-June 2016.

The main factors of sustainable GDP growth were the growth rates of the main sectors of the economy, such as agriculture, forestry and fishing – 105,8 percent (the share in GDP structure -8,6 percent), industry – 105,7 percent (27,5 percent), construction – 108,7 percent (8,1 percent), trade and accommodation and food services – 110,4 percent (12 percent), transportation and storage, information and communication – 106,9 percent (14,9 percent), and other services sectors – 107,0 percent (28,9 percent).

Branch structure of gross domestic product in January-June is characterized by the following data (as percent of total):



In January-June 2017 the share of services in the GDP

structure was 55,8 percent or 0,2 percentage points lower than in January-June 2016 (56,0 percent). The share of transportation and storage, information and communication decreased by 0,9 percentage points

and was 14,9 percent in the reporting period. The share of trade, accommodation and food services increased by 0,6 percentage points and was 12,0 percent and that of other services sectors increased from 28,8 percent in January-June 2016 to 28,9 percent in January-June 2017.

In the GDP structure by form of ownership the share of the non-state sector is 78,8 percent and that of the state sector - 21,2 percent.

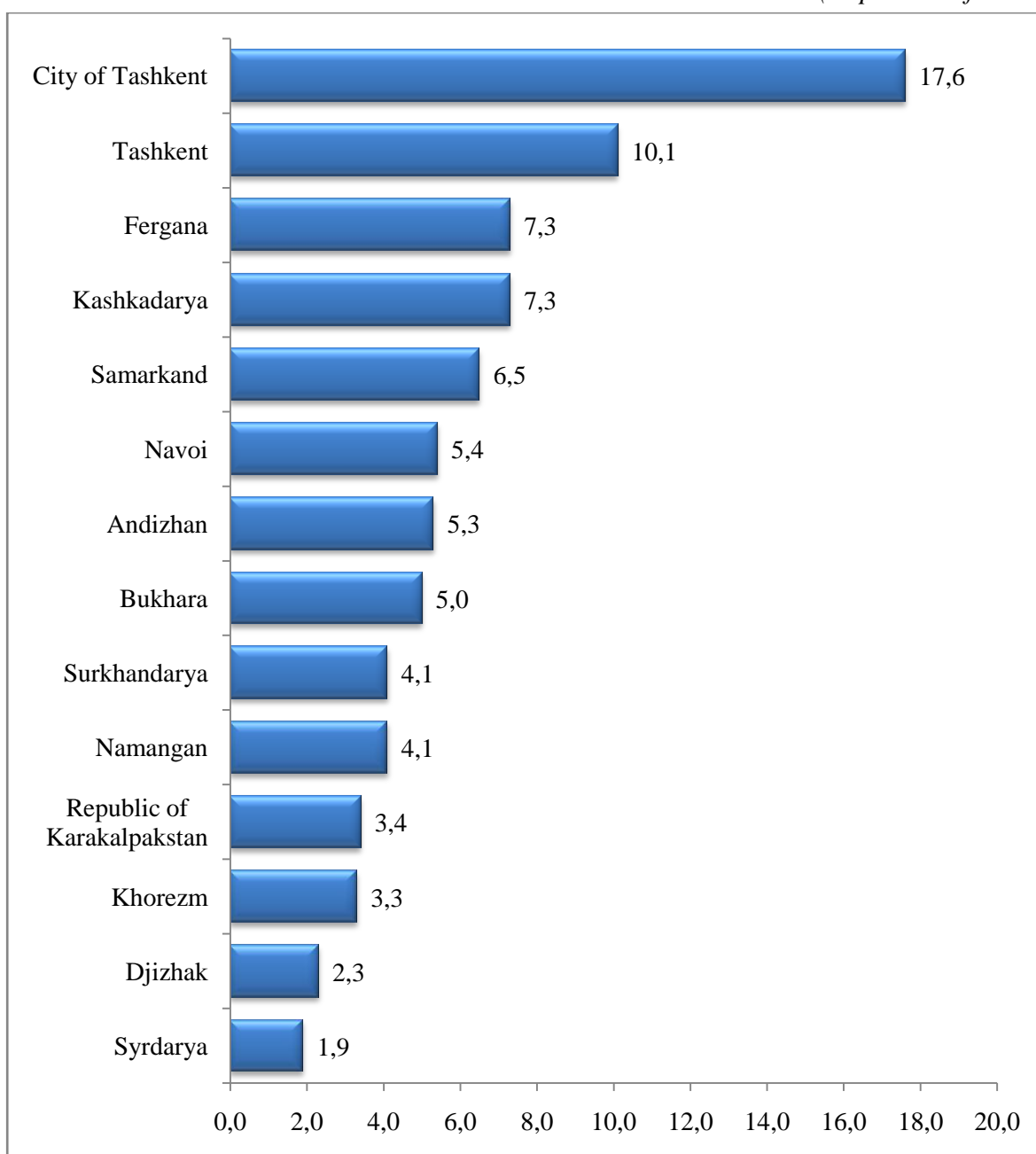
As a result of the implementation of targeted regional programs the outstripping GDP growth rates in January-June 2017 were marked in Khorezm region (111,3 percent), Andizhan region (110,8 percent), and Djizhak region (108,0 percent). Low GRP growth rates compared to

the republican level (107.0 percent) were observed in Navoi region (103.4 percent), Tashkent region (104.6%), and Surkhandarya region (104.8 percent).

The highest share of GRP contributed to the republic's GDP is marked in the city of Tashkent - 17,6 percent, Tashkent region and Fergana region occupy following places with 10,1 percent and 7,3 percent respectively. The lowest GRP share is registered in Syrdarya region (1,9 percent), Djizhak region (2,3 percent), and Khorezm region (3,3 percent).
